Summary:

This project will carry out a literature review (peer reviewed and jurisdictional reports) to identify likely effects of climate change on food environments in the ACT and how government Health Promotion activities might respond to these challenges. Some stakeholder interviews may form part of this project.

Food environments are the physical, economic, political and socio-cultural contexts in which people engage with the food system to make their decisions about acquiring, preparing and consuming food. Health Promotion aims to influence the food environment to support healthy eating among the public in order to reduce the risk factors for a range of chronic conditions.
